With this in mind, this course examines their functions, current spectrum of activities and management.

They are expected to observe the achievements of SAEMAUL UNDONG and other related data. The students will also have opportunity to talk with local residents who have participated in community development and conduct interviews with them. It will be able to apply Korea's development experiences to international development projects through field study. Students will conduct pre- and post-field-trip sessions to prepare and present feedback the results of the field trip in order to make the field study more effective.

It will help students to define problems systematically, and to apply analytical tools in the service of better policy decisions. Students will also learn some practical tools in conducting policy analysis, and employ case studies to illustrate the concepts and techniques of policy analysis and debate.

In so doing, this course aims to study citizen participation types and activities. The roles of government, NGO, and citizen participation in policy making process under modern democratic systems are empirically analysed; importance and role of civil society are reviewed; and effective ways of governance system are investigated. In addition, empowerment of residents to lead the community as citizens in democratic society and system to secure their pivotal role in establishing local community are discussed.

Visiting sites include industrial complex, R&D centers, physical infra such as dams and expressways, and institutions involved in development policies. Students are required to submit a report regarding the sites they have visited.

FOREST RESOURCES AND ECOLOGICAL RESTORATION MAJOR	3rd semester students	MAJOR	산림경제학	0013	FOREST ECONOMICS	3	MON 13:30 - 16:20	602	LEE YOCHAN	5	Compulsory	This course is taught to provide basic knowledge and theories on forest economics that concentrates on choices with respect to a particular limited resource, forests. This course supposes that students will study the tools of financial investment analysis. Students will apply the mathematics of investment analysis to evaluate alternative land management regimes. This course also provides information on how the wood products sector is structured. Student will study what factors affect consumer demand for wood-using goods, derived demand for wood as an input to the production of wood products, and supply of timber and wood products. In addition, this course deal with the role of forests in producing both market and nonmarket goods.
	3rd semester students	MAJOR	산림생태학	0014	FOREST ECOLOGY	3	TUE 13:30 - 16:20	602	LEE HAKJUN	5	Compulsory	This course is aimed at understanding the forest ecosystem which deals 1) the distribution of plant species in the forest, 2) interrelationship between plant individuals and environmental factors, 3) competition between plant individuals, 4) symbiotic relations and roles of woody species in the ecosystem, 5) various environmental factors which influence the forest, and 6) responding strategy of woody species to the environmental changes. Tree growth, competition between woody species or other organisms, interrelationship between woody species and environment, adaptation mechanism of trees to changes in environment, time and spaces, forest succession, and ecological forest management are also discussed.
